## YYHI Rec Rules

## Article IV: General

## Section 1: Mission Statement

The primary mission of YYHI shall be to promote, develop and install fundamentally sound skills, sportsmanship, fair play, and team unity in Yuma's dedicated youth athletes in the sport of hockey.

## Section 2: $\quad$ This Code of Conduct has been adopted by Yuma Youth Hockey, Inc. for the Yuma Youth Hockey League (YYHL) as the detailed policy that will be followed by COACHES, PLAYERS and PARENTS/FANS. This Code of Conduct is in addition to the rules and policies of the YYHL and RHA Hockey.

1. All YYHL coaches must obtain and carry RHA Membership/ Insurance annually after September 1st of each year.
2. All YYHL coaches must attend Concussion Certification Classes, bi-annually. https://www.cdc.gov/headsup/youthsports/coach.html

3 All YYHL coaches will be required to complete an annual background check with Safe Coach Background Checks.
4. All YYHL coaches will be required to sign the YYHL Code of Conduct and Discipline form.
5. A good example by both players and coaches will be set at all times while on rink property as you are representatives of the YYHL.
6. NO use of obscene or abusive language or behavior on the bench, on the rink or in the stands at any time while at the sporting event. The YYHL Board will investigate any reports of such actions, and by a majority vote, may remove the responsible party for any behavior deemed unsatisfactory.
7. NO abusive language or behavior from players, parents, spectators, or coaches towards game officials (referees), anyone from or with the opposing team, or any rink personnel, at any time before, during or after the game. This also includes any involvement in social media. Coaches may remove any player or coach from the bench during a game for abusive behavior. The YYHL Board will determine the penalty for coaches violating this rule.
8. Coaches will not tolerate abusive behavior from players or parents; nor will they tolerate any obscenities from players or parents at any time.
9. It is the Coach's decision to suspend or remove players from the game and/or roster for violating the abusive behavior rules; the coach will submit a proposal for suspension/removal to the YYHL board for final decision by majority vote.
10. Coaches are responsible for the players and their actions before, during and after games and
practices and at all times while on rink property while assembled as a team.
11. Coaches will make all decisions concerning playing time, game strategies and game management; players and parents are not to question or argue these matters with the coaching staff.
12. Fighting will not be tolerated. Fighting will result in an appearance before the YYHL Board.
13. Players are required to notify their coach when they cannot attend a practice or game. Failure to do so could result in the player being benched for all or a portion of a game.

## Section 3: Divisions/Eligibility

Division is determined by the player's date of birth as of December 31 of the current year. Girls may have one additional year of eligibility in each division. YYHI will strive to have the following divisions, although some divisions may be combined to support an adequate number of players and teams in each division:

- 6U
- 8U
- 10U
- 12 U
- 14 U
- 16U
- 18 U (must be enrolled in high school)

The Board of Directors reserves the right to place a player in a different division more appropriate for his/her skill level.

## Section 4: Rules and Regulations of the Game:

YYHI will follow the rules and regulations as provided by Roller Hockey Alliance (RHA) or an approved national organization. Any changes made to the rules and regulation will be approved by the Board of Directors before the playing season starts. A list of changes will be reviewed by the referees and coaches at a scheduled meeting before the season starts.
A. Playing Time: The coach will make every effort to ensure that all players receive equal playing time.

The only exceptions to this rule are:

1. Injury or illness;
2. Disciplinary reasons (reason for action must be noted on score sheet prior to game start);
3. Short-handed teams.

Coaches in the 6 U and 8 U Divisions will match lines to the skill level of the opposing team's lines (i.e., a weaker line vs a weaker line, a strong line vs a strong line).
B. Positions: Coaches should rotate team members in as many playing positions as possible to allow them to learn the game. However, positioning of players is at the discretion of the head coach.
C. Registration: Player membership in YYHI is acknowledged only after the player has registered and required fee has been paid. All teams are final as of the date of the draft. No late registrations will be accepted.

However, the Board may consider late registration for player(s) who have never played for YYHI up to the $7^{\text {th }}$ day post draft. Following this date, no additional players will be added.
D. False Registration: review. "Illegally registered" includes, but is not limited to, providing a false birth certificate.
E. Player Safety: No player will be allowed to play if they are wearing anything that could cause injury to themselves of other players. No player will be allowed to play with any type of orthopedic cast (exception Rule 305(a) of RHA Rules). No player with an injury that may be aggravated by playing, or that may endanger others, will be allowed to play. Equipment Requirements:

Mandatory: HECC approved Hockey Helmet with full attached face guard and chin guard
Mouth Guard
Shin/Knee Guards
Hockey Gloves
Elbow Pads
Skates for roller hockey (no brakes)
Hockey Stick (no plastic blades for 10 U and up)
Athletic supporter and cup for boys
Optional: Shoulder and Chest Pads, pelvic protection for girls
F. Practice: Coaches are to practice no more than three hours per week after the regular season begins. Player conduct at practices is subject to the same standard as listed above.
G. Ejections: Any player, coach, spectator, or referee may be ejected from a game and future games for the following reasons:

1. Serious physical play or physical assault directed at another player, coach, spectator, or referee.
2. Any foul language or obscene gestures used or directed at another player, coach, spectator, or referee.
3. Any violations that warrant ejection under the league approved rulebook.
4. Any second ejection would require the participant to go before the Board to petition for reinstatement.

Excessive Penalties- If a player has received 3 penalties within one game, there will be an automatic removal of that player from the remainder of the game. This player will be removed from the game and escorted to the dressing area after he/she serves the penalty.

This rule supports our Mission Statement which is to promote both fair play and sportsmanship among our players at all age and skill levels, regardless of the skill level of the player or opponent.

## Section 5: Coaches

All coaches must provide full name, birthdate, and SS\# for use in background screenings.

Any coach who violates the Code of Ethics and/or Rules and Regulations is subject to disciplinary action by the Board up to and including suspension and/or removal.

## Section 6: Uniforms

Uniforms purchased by YYHI will be of like construction purchased from a Board approved supplier. Only the player number and sponsor information will be printed on player uniforms. No player names will be printed on the uniforms. Any league member making any alterations to league uniforms will be required to replace the uniform at their expense. Uniforms should only be worn during scheduled games. Players that do not have their uniforms for game time may be provided an appropriate uniform to wear.

## Section 7: Draft

A player draft will be completed prior to start of playing season. Rules for the draft will be reviewed with all coaches prior to the draft.

## Section 8: Rosters

A) Teams will consist of no more than 14 players
B) No changes to the team rosters will be made unless they are reviewed and approved for a $3 / 4$ majority of YYHI Board Members.
